

Ethics in Action Course

Materials:

- Ethics in Action CD-ROM
- Ethics statements
- Time Sheet

All the course materials will be supplied to you without cost as long as they are returned in useable condition. (\$50.00 fee will be charged if the original CD-ROM is not returned). During the course, if you have any questions, call either Gigi Dunbar at the Racine campus or Dr. Feleke in Chicago.

Time Frame:

The complete CD-ROM material must be turned in prior to the 12th week of the quarter. Your final examination is based upon an understanding of ethical behavior that includes the CD and also your own knowledge, experience and opinions. This course is based upon a combination of independent study, directed research, and interaction with a faculty member. Run the CD-ROM and follow the instructions. At the end of each module, save and print your responses. The steps are as follows:

1. Log on to the NCCAOM website, download and print the current ethics statements.
2. Log on to the state licensing division website in which you intend to practice, download and print any ethics components of the licensure. If the state you choose has limited or no ethics components within their regulations choose another state. Australia has a good statement in its license.
3. Log on to a national association website, download and print any ethics components.
4. Follow the CD-ROM instructional material and be sure to save and print your work at the end of each module.
5. Prior to the beginning of the 12th week, turn in your printouts from the ethics CD-ROM along with the entire course materials.
6. You must take the final examination by the 12th week with Gigi Dunbar in Racine or Dr. Feleke in Chicago

All materials should be turned in at the time you take your test. The submission and you test score must be turned in to receive the final grade.

Grading:

- 25% Submission of the appropriate ethics statements. (NCCAOM and at least one state)
- 25% Final examination based upon the CD-ROM and the Ethics Statements
- 50% Submission of the Ethics printed responses from the CD-ROM

Submission:

Each component of the course, which is submitted, must be in a report cover or binder.

Ethics in Action CD-ROM

Each module begins with a pre-inventory that gives preliminary information and a self-assessment that gauges the student's knowledge in the subject area. Students are then asked to select a segment and watch the role play of the ethical dilemma and answer several reflective questions. After answering the questions, the student watches a classroom discussion that brings up pertinent issues and examines the approach taken by the counselor. At the completion of each module, the post-inventory assesses the student's competence after completing the material in the module. After each segment, the student has the opportunity to save, print, or e-mail their answers to the reflective questions.
